Water is a Human Right

It is time to celebrate! Finally, on the 28th of July, the UN General Assembly passed a resolution entitled "The Human Right to Water and Sanitation," with 122 states voting in favor. This is a momentous step toward a future treaty. The resolution calls for states and international organizations to provide financial resources, transfer technology and build capacity to ensure that water and sanitation is clean, safe and accessible for all.

The GA expressed concern that 884 million people are without safe drinking water and 2.6 billion lack basic sanitation. As a result of unsafe water and lack of sanitation, 1.5 million children under 5 years old die each year of waterborne illnesses. As is well known throughout SI/E, water is a key issue for women and girls. They are often responsible for collecting water, which takes away precious time from school or paid employment possibilities and also can put them at risk on their long journeys. Decision-making about water issues requires a gender perspective, but unfortunately, women's voices are often not heard publicly. - Petitions/Government: Write letters to your local officials, asking them to support International Day of Peace
- Education: Organize seminars and lectures about peace building in your community/organization, include discussions and work groups
- Sports/Health: Organize a "Yoga for Peace" class, including a meditation on peace

In order to imbue the participants of the 8th European Meeting and Friendship Days with optimism, we have invited inspiring speakers. Let us introduce them:

Pilar Oriente Guarido became the first female counselor in the Malaga Town Hall in 1979 and is currently the coordinator of the Andalusian Women's Institute, working for the rights of women, denouncing discrimination and ensuring equality for all. Marta Eugenia Rodríguez de la Torre received a scholarship for young science investigators at the age of 13 and later developed a unique method of learning and intellectual stimulation. Carmen Sebastián founded a company developing courses related to personal development and projects concerning the Management of Communication, each with emotion as its basis and strategic guide. Eva Levy currently heads the Women on the Board of Directors division of the prestigious headhunting company ExcellentSearch. Her personal commitment and dedication to the career development of women is paramount to her professional life. Carmen García Ribas is a journalist and expert in strategic communication and development of managers. Ten years ago she began her work on the ideology of Feminine Leadership.

Soroptimist condemns Prostitution

During their biennial convention in July 2010, the Soroptimist International of the Americas (SIA) club delegates voted to forward a resolution committing itself to take a stand against prostitution of any kind to the clubs for a mail ballot. After hearing a speech of author and journalist Victor Malarek, SIA has recommended following the model of the Swedish

government and tackle prostitution by targeting the demand. This means SIA will condemn the purchase of sex and those who seek to exploit women or girls as sexual objects rather than condemning prostituted women or girls. The Federation will also engage to condemn and boycott companies and organizations that support and promote the sale of sex. For example, while in San Francisco, they co-sponsored an event in San Francisco at the Craigslist Headquarters to draw attention to its facilitation and profit from the sex trade. Craigslist is a public forum to sell goods, which has been now widely used as a means to sell sex. Some of SIA's plans to combat sexual exploitation include raising awareness that prostitution is a form of violence against women, educating men and boys on gender equality and the damage of buying sex, and supporting the development of sexual education in schools.
